




-  “The Bosses.” Periodically, the Base Commander, Schools Superintendent, College President, City Manager, and their chief assistants meet to discuss mutual problems, and discuss any projects “in the works.” The City hosted the most recent meeting. Craig Peterson has begun attending meetings of “The Bosses” to represent the county government. Other “new faces” included newly-appointed Base Commander Mick Gleason, and Interim College President Dr. Mary Retterer. There was discussion of the new medical marijuana shop; the schedule for appointment of a “permanent” College President (i.e. a little over a year); street paving “conflicts” with access to the Base; and more. The Fall meeting of “The Bosses” will be hosted by the School District.



The City Council adopted Resolution 06-52, a Resolution adopting the "Bowman Drainage Channel Park" in concept at their regular meeting of July 12th. The creation of a design concept which directs staff to incorporate a linear park, greenbelt, and drainage course along the Bowman Road Channel from W. Downs St. to E. Ridgecrest Blvd. for potential incorporation into the Ridgecrest General Plan and the Master Drainage Plan as they are reviewed, rewritten, updated, and re-adopted. The flood retention channel would be redesigned to provide a gentler slopes, and/or rip rap along the south side abutting Bowman Road. A safety fence with seasonal access would be installed at the edge of sidewalk. A drainage profile with varying depths would be provided with a potential barrier between them to allow the upper northern channel to be used as a motorcycle dirt trail during the dry seasons. The existing bikeway would remain the northern boundary of the channel, or redesigned to suit new improvements. The existing right-of-way will allow a frontage road to the north of the bikeway in some areas. Rest areas might encroach into this area in some locations where a frontage road is not planned or desired. Landscaping would be held to a minimum, and the use of native plants and Xeriscaping utilized within and adjoining the channel. Portions of the landscaping might utilize wastewater effluent that has been appropriately treated for irrigation usage.

The Ridgecrest Chamber of Commerce introduced its new electronic community reader board at the northeast west corner of Bowman Road and S. China Lake Blvd. Limited landscaping and improvements are also planned for the immediate area. Community Group may post events and items of community interest by contacting

Wastewater Headwork's and Digester Cleaning


Work continues on this project. Completion is anticipated to be in mid-September of 2006. A study has commenced to determine the feasibility of either expanding the existing waste water treatment plant or to construct a completely new plant to provide for future waste water treatment demands.

Private Sector Projects

The demand for inspection and plan checking is still increasing primarily in the commercial and residential sectors. There are currently about 38 new residential subdivisions being processed with a total of more than 3200 new lots. In addition to these there are about 1500 lots in the Ridgecrest Heights area that are vacant and buildable

Street Projects

Caltrans is in the process of capping China Lake Boulevard and Ridgecrest Boulevard (SH 178). Traffic and ambient day time temperatures have forced work to be done at night. Work on the Mahan, Graaf and Reeves projects should commence this week.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

A total of 36 permits were issued in July. Of the permits issued in July, one was a Single Family Residence (SFR) permit. As of July 31st a total of \$47,417.40 has been collected in impact fees. This month we welcomed a new and much appreciated Building Technician, Dorene Morgan.

WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT

The City of Ridgecrest Wastewater Treatment Facility operated within compliance and design directives issued under Board Order No. 6-00-56. The treatment facility operated with no discharge violations for the month of July 2006.

The department inspected and passed nine new connections to the sanitary sewer system.


The reclamation department reclaimed 9.6 million gallons of secondary effluent for use as fodder crop irrigation.

The department hydro flushed 2,000 ft of main line sewer as preventative maintenance.

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

With the month of July we have seen a continuation of the many projects that were started in June with them going through the Engineering and Planning process. Several projects were considered by the Planning and Zoning Committee and they provided excellent guidance to both the staff and the developers involved.



The Business Park is still seeing activity with several new projects being discussed.

At the Corner of Ridgecrest and China Lake Boulevards, the Rite Aid Pharmacy project is moving forward with new elevations and landscape plans being reviewed by staff for approval.



The Draft EIR (Environmental Impact Report) for the Wal-Mart Superstore project is now being finalized and should be available next month for the first review by staff expected publication to be sometime later in the year.



We are also actively involved

with Kern County in planning issues of the Development of a new General Plan update, which we hope will also include an airport flight overlay for the base.

There were several housing projects that were approved this month as well.

The Director was on vacation in Wyoming this month, working hard on bringing new business opportunities to Ridgecrest from Dubois. Dubois has a population of only 453 people but lots of fish and wildlife.

1. A Benchmark Opinions proposal located on 60 acres at the Southeast corner of Bataan Avenue and Sunland Street proposing 158 single family homes and 123 condominium units, (approved on August 8, 2006),
2. A PAM Development proposal located on 9 acres on Sanders north of Bowman to create a 45 lot Single Family Residential subdivision, (approved on August 8, 2006),
3. An AMG Associates Site Plan Review for a 81 Unit Family Housing Complex with a Community Center located on 6 acres at 340 South Downs Street, (to be considered by the Planning Commission on August 22, 2006),
4. An AMG Associates proposal to rezone 7.8 acres located at the Northeast corner of Richmond Street and East Upjohn Avenue from Commercial to R-1, (to be considered by the Planning Commission on August 22, 2006)

Fire Season, West Nile Virus head enforcement efforts.

With the dry heat and raising temperatures in the valley the Code enforcement Division focused its attention on fire prevention and the eradication of any form of West Nile Virus within the city limits.



The Division was generally pleased with the efforts of the community to comply with the mowing and trimming of lawns and weeds that had dried out this summer.



Unfortunately, our valley suffered through a few home fires, but for the most part our residents were keenly aware of the problems and were more than ready to comply with requests from the Division to rid their properties of fire hazards.



West Nile Virus is a dangerous epidemic that has yet to reach the valley. The Code Enforcement Division responded to each call for service immediately after the call was received. Armed with tablets that kill the mosquito larva in standing water, pools were treated and cleaned by residents throughout the summer months. Our valley is not out of the woods yet. The head standard will be with us for a few more months, which will mean larva will be still be able to grow in pools of standing water.



One word of advice to the community from the Division would be: Take the West Nile Virus seriously. Even if you don't have a pool (of any sort), standing water in a dog or cat's water bowl, a fountain, along the curbs and gutters and over-watering lawns can all be sources for West Nile Virus contamination.

Special points of interest:

On July 18, 2006, the Ridgecrest Police Department conducted, "Operation Summer Heat", a Multi-Agency Parole and Probation Sweep. The Agencies involved were State Parole, Kern County Probation and members of the Ridgecrest Police Department. The emphasis of this operation was proactive enforcement compliance checks of local parolees and probationers. As a result, the Operation

The Police Department has been awarded a \$10,000 grant to conduct a minor decoy pro-

gram that is intended to reduce the availability of alcohol to minors. There is no matching funds requirement with this grant and the program will run for 20 months.

It goes without saying that Officer Armogida continues to support the Department with his professionalism and dedication.





