City Manager Avery brought forth to City Council a resolution supporting the California Public Utilities Commission decision to retain the existing 760 area code in all areas outside of northern San Diego County. OFFICERS APPREHEND CRIME SPREE SUSPECTS

RPD AND CHP RETURN STOLEN PROPERTY TO OWNERS

On 09/10/2008, Officers Armogida and Lloyd investigated a crime spree that occurred over several weeks, culminating with the residential burglary of a local Law Enforcement officer (CHP Officer Simmons).

Using good investigative tools, the Officers conducted searches at several locations and ultimately arrested several suspects whom were involved in the crime spree and burglary.

The officers also recovered numerous items of stolen property including jewelry, credit cards, and a firearm.

The recovered property was returned to owners, and the suspects were booked or cited out based on their involvement in the cases.

PACT and Nuisance Abatement have finally come together. During the recent PACT Academy, which graduated 23 people, Code Enforcement Officer



Bob Smith conducted Nuisance Abatement training for 18 PACT Volunteers. During the month of September, these volunteers turned 14 Code Enforcement complaint forms in to Mr. Smith. The latest plan for PACT and Code Enforcement is for the PACT Volunteers to begin assisting in the enforcement of yard sale sign violations.

Also on the PACT front, 175 children were processed for Child ID during the September 27th United Way family Fun Fair. In the unlikely event that the child becomes missing or abducted, the information gathered by Child ID could become beneficial in obtaining the safe return of the child.

CRIME SUPPRESSION UNIT

During the month of September, Detectives from the Crime Suppression Unit served 1 search warrant and arrested 5 people for narcotic related activities. These actions help curtail narcotics related activity in the city and reduce related criminal activity.

LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES 2008 ANNUAL CONFERENCE


City staff , the City Manager, Mayor and Mayor Pro-tem attended the League of California Cities 2008 Annual Conference and Exposition September 24 through September 27, in Long Beach California. This years theme was Sailing into the Future. The Keynote speakers addressed the following: Mr. Neal Petersen; "No Barriers Only Solutions", few people have realized their dreams, he demonstrated his by sailing around the world in a home built boat and choosing conquest over adversity, changing disadvantages into advantages, and the power of positive attitude. Richard Florida; "Who's Your City", a leading public intellectual on economic competitiveness, demographic trends, and cultural innovation on the way people choose the places they live and its effects of everything from their real estate to their families. Doris Kearns Goodwin; "Lessons in Leadership", an historian and storyteller's perspective on illustrating lessons relevant to today's issues and headlines. The Institute for Local Government presentation by Manuel Pastor, Professor, USC, "Local Leadership and the Changing Demographics of California Communities. Concurrent Sessions and Presentations allowed the staff to attend various topics of interest and provide better overall coverage of topics of interest to the City. September, 2008

The Ridgecrest General Plan Advisory Committee, (GPAC), met on September 23, 2008.

1. DISCUSSION OF DRAFT CHILD CARE GOAL AND POLICIES

GPAC considered recommendations from Tina French, representing E.S.A.C., and Dana Adams, with the Kern LINCC Project, about the background information including a synopsis of Child Care Service Levels in East Kern indicating a shortfall of care provided in Ridgecrest. They recommended a Childcare goal for GPAC as well as a number of sample policies for GPAC to consider in order to improve childcare services within Ridgecrest.

Ms. French said that whilst the General Plan had referenced essential services it had not included child care services – which had a deficit - saying that the expected growth would worsen the problem. She spoke about policies in the land use element not including child care services. Ms. French asked that GPAC consider child care an essential service and consider how it might be implemented into the General Plan. She said sample policies had been included and that Dana Adams would speak to those further.

Dana Adams – Bakersfield – Child Care intermediary – involved in a project with Kern County Child Care Council. Ms. Adams said she was advocating for a good, safe, developmentally appropriate quality place to go – when children were not in school and parents were in the workforce. Ms. Adams said that Ridgecrest was short approximately 1,000 child care places (accounting for anticipated growth associated with B.R.A.C.) which meant that there was a need to develop child care centers.

She said she hoped to heighten the awareness for this need. Ms. Adams said that sample policies had been developed since 2005 and these policies sought a child care needs assessment be completed with each

new development including discussions with current facilities in regards to absorbing any needs identified. She spoke about the broader needs of the County in conjunction with the City's needs.

There was concurrence to adopt sample policy number 5 with a change to wording as suggested:


“Encourage the development of child care facilities and services, including collaboration between schools and parks, faith based institutions, community centers, senior centers, and unused public and private facilities.”

2. LAND USE MAP UPDATE - MIDDLETOWNE

Planner Alexander introduced Pamela Hill – Assistant Planner saying she was an invaluable assistance to Planning and GPAC. GPAC approved amendments to the Land Use Map. An exception was the large undeveloped area in midtown Ridgecrest lying between Las Flores and Felspar and between China Lake Blvd. to Norma Street.

Following the GPAC meeting, GPAC members voted via email, choosing among three alternative land use plans for this area. The consensus Land Use plan for Middletowne recommended by 2/3 of GPAC members is alternative C below:



PLANNING COMMISSION:

September 23, 2008

On September 23, 2008 the Planning Commission considered a plan proposed by Trane to develop a solar design to provide energy for the City Hall, Police Station and Kerr McGee Center built upon carports.



The purpose of the Planning Commission discussion was to focus around three major topics contained in this project.

A site plan depicting a reorganization of the northern parking lot. This area has been designated as a new secured area for city vehicles and employee parking. It now limits the flow of easterly or westerly traffic through city property by inclosing the parking with block structures and gated entrances.

The installation of covered photo voltaic parking structures. The majority of the configuration surrounding the type and location of these structures has been deeply examined by committee and Council. Much of what is proposed is restrictive on performance of the solar arrays, and,

The central plant providing a facilities wide solution for air conditioning. This plant consists of three major elements; chillers, water towers, and cold (ice) storage. Noise, spray, and performance are just a few of the concerns surrounding the location of this equipment.

The next Planning commission meeting shall be held on October 28, 2008.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

All in all a busy month with the major emphasis being our ongoing work in retail and new hotel developments.

Projects in progress include a convention center museum and hotel development (discussed at the Community Development Committee meeting. This development, if completed, will bring over 55,000 sq. feet of new convention space, a new museum of over 24,000 sq. feet and a new four star hotel with 200 plus rooms. A new office building would also potentially house the RACVB and the Chamber Offices as well as a State of California Visitor's Center.

Planning continues for Super Wal Mart (with Public Hearings anticipated in the next couple of months) and other developments including the remodel of the existing Wal Mart to over 120,000 sq. feet of new retail space. Discussions are ongoing with two retailers for development in the new Wal Mart complex – bringing total potential for new retail space over 500,000 sq ft.

Construction of the Hampton Inn will begin in the next two months and will include a second office building and restaurant site.

Onto new jobs in the valley – staff continues their work with Solar Millennium and two other power generation firms. Although these developments may be several years away – they will bring new jobs and opportunities to the valley and represent a viable new industry for Ridgecrest.

During September staff attended other meetings and events including the RACVB Board and Tourism working group, Community Development Committee meeting, the USO opening, IWV Water District meeting, Economic Outlook planning group, Chamber Board meeting, China Lake Museum Board meeting, Chamber After Hours, Military Affairs meeting and Rotary Sign working group meeting.

Support was provided to the Boys and Girls Club building improvement project (through work with the County of Kern Community Development Department) and two new businesses moving into the Ridgecrest Plaza. Assistance was also provided to several developers who continue to look at Ridgecrest for potential development of new housing - several of whom are seeking entitlement through planning.

Highlights for the month were planning for the View Finders Grand Prix event and attending the California League of Cities Conference in Long Beach from September 24th through September 27th.

Kern COG's 2008 Summer Quarterly Newsletter Reports:

Kern gets \$50 million for 2008 transportation projects



The Kern region will plan on receiving about \$50 million in new funding over the next five years for transportation projects, including the Westside Parkway in Bakersfield, State Route 119 and West Ridgecrest Boulevard, according to California Transportation Commission (CTC) estimates.

Under the 2008 Transportation Improvement Program funding cycle, Kern COG staff identified \$49.8 million for new programming and presented Kern COG's Board of Directors with an updated project list that includes the new estimate. Several projects already partially funded for pre-construction and construction work were considered, including:

Westside Parkway – an additional \$31.1 million was added to the construction phase;

State Route 119 – Cherry Ave. to Tupman Ave Widening – \$4.5 million was programmed for design;

West Ridgecrest Boulevard – Reconstruction – \$6.2 million for construction;

SR 14 – Freeman Gulch Widening – \$2.5 million was introduced for design

SR 46 – I-5 to SLO County Line 4 lane widening – \$4 million for pre-construction phases

Challenger Drive Extension (near Dennison Road and State Route 58) – \$1.56 million for construction.

Projects scheduled for construction over the next four years include the Westside Parkway, State Route 46 widening, Challenger Drive extension, and the **West Ridgecrest Boulevard** re-construction project. The widening projects on State Route 119 and

14 are still in the pre-construction phases and will require future funding for rights-of-way and construction work.

The new funding may or may not materialize over the STIP's five-year cycle. Kern has seen its funding estimate fall from roughly \$98 million in 2000 to less than \$50 million today

Other projects set for construction include a widening along 7th Standard Road from Coffee Road to Santa Fe Way, in which Kern County officials will spend about \$31 million in local bond funding and two projects already under construction: the Fairfax interchange on State Route 178; and grade separation and interchange work at 7th Standard Road and State.



flushed 6,595 ft. of main line sewer as preventative maintenance.

The department continued levy maintenance on the 238 acre lagoon system.


Transit

The Transit Department experienced an increase in ridership in September due to Cerro Coso College starting the Fall semester. Ridership reached 3,026 trips for September with several new riders trying out the transit system. Efforts were launched this month to decrease the radio time between our dispatcher and our buses in the field. With every call from or to the

buses, the dispatcher must take time away from answering booking requests and taking phone calls. We have tried to increase the number of runs given out in advance of the actual ride time request from the passenger. Ordinarily the drivers would receive their next hours runs from the dispatcher every hour when they clear their previous

hours trips. By dispatching two hours ahead, we have better control of the minimum two hour advance call in time and we free up an additional 15 minutes for
