

In March of 2009, a Ventura County resident reported to the Ventura County Sheriff's Office that Ridgecrest resident, Melvin Henderson, had molested her five-year-old daughter. Although Henderson was living in Ventura County at the time of the reported offense, he was previously a resident of the City of Ridgecrest and lived in the 400 block of Florence Street. During the subsequent investigation, Henderson admitted to molesting the Ventura County child victim.

While Henderson was being held in the Ventura County Jail, another child victim disclosed that Henderson had molested her while she lived in the City of Ridgecrest. The victim and her parents reported Henderson cared for her while her parents were out of town or at work and it was during those times, that he would repeatedly molest her. During an interview with Henderson, he admitted to the allegations made by the second child victim. Henderson admitted to numerous allegations of child molestation. Henderson also admitted to showing the child pornography and taking nude photos of her.

At this time, the Ridgecrest Police Department and Ventura Sheriff's Office are requesting that any parent who may have children that had contact with Henderson or who suspect Henderson may have victimized their children, to contact Detective Kristen Lawson, Ridgecrest Police Department (760-499-5114) or Detective Gregory Tougas, Ventura County Sheriff's Office (805-371-8397).

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of April, Detective Kenny Merzlak was assigned a total of 14 cases and completed 12 cases. Detective Merzlak and the Warrant Service Team assisted the Kern County Narcotics Enforcement Team (KNET) with a search warrant in Rosamond, CA. The search warrant target was arrested for drug related offenses. Detective Merzlak conducted several follow-up investigations for assigned cases throughout the month. On 04/28/11, Detective Merzlak was assigned to assist Officer Sloan with a burglary investigation, in which the suspect (Patrick Malone) was arrested after attempting a daytime residential burglary and was possibly linked to other burglaries within Ridgecrest. After conducting a lengthy investigation, Officer Sloan and Detective Merzlak were able to determine that Malone was involved in four (4) total residential burglaries and at least four (4) thefts from vehicles. This investigation resulted in various items of property being recovered and returned to their owners, which totaled \$4,624.00.

In April, Detective Cory Ballestero spent two weeks in Santa Cruz Ca. at Defensive Tactics Instructor Training. The training included several areas of arrest and control techniques and certified him by POST as a Defensive Tactics Instructor. He completed the follow up investigation into the HS 11351- Sales of Narcotics case against John Frost. John Frost was supplying hundreds of Oxycodone pills each month to drug dealers in the Ridgecrest area. The case is finished and has been sent to the San Diego County District Attorney's Office for prosecution. During the month of April, Detective Ballestero was assigned 14 new cases.

This month, Detective Kristen Lawson continued her work on numerous CPS referrals, domestic violence cases, and sexual assault/molestation cases. She was the "Officer in Charge" for the Detective Bay for a week while the Investigations Supervisor was at training. On 04/13/2011, Detective Lawson was recognized by the Victim Witness Auxiliary Board and the Kern County Probation Department Victim Witness Program for "Dedicated Service to the Victim's of Kern County" during a ceremony in Bakersfield, CA. She received additional recognition from members of the U.S. Congress, California State Senate, and the California State Assembly. She has also been working with the Ventura County District Attorney's office in the investigation and prosecution of Melvin Henderson, a former Ridgecrest resident, who had molested several young girls in Ridgecrest and Ventura County.

Detective Manual Castaneda continued his investigation into the firebombing of the Sierra Sands Unified School District Office that occurred in February. The case was submitted to the District Attorney's Office and a warrant issued for the second suspect and former school employee, Marcos Herrera. Herrera was subsequently arrested and bound over for trial after his preliminary hearing.

This month under the ABC grant, two (2) Shoulder Tap Operations were conducted with the assistance of RPD Explorers. The two operations resulted in the arrests of three (3) persons for furnishing or selling alcohol to a minor.




The Reserve Officers achieved a total of 21 hours for the month of April. Officer Regan contributed 10 hours, while Officer Kinslow contributed 6 hours.


Reserve and range meetings accounted for 54 percent of administration time with 14 hours.

Patrol time accounted for 15 percent of the total reserve hours with 4 hours. Reserve Officer Kinslow provided those 4 hours.




Wastewater Department

The City of Ridgecrest WWTF operated within design and compliance directives issued under Board Order No. 6-00-56. The treatment facility operated with no discharge violations or abnormal conditions. The Department inspected and passed (4) new connection to the sanitary sewage system. The Department responded to (3) requests for service, after inspection (1) proved to be related to the homeowners service lateral

and (2) were stoppages of the main line, caused by illegal grease discharges. The Reclamation Department reclaimed 4.16 million gallons of secondary effluent for use as fodder crop irrigation. The Department hydro flushed 8,800 ft. of main line sewer for compliance with the SSO and SSMP program. The Department in compliance with Board Order directives sampled the ground water up gradient and down gradi-

ent of the WWTF and Reclamation Facility, the laboratory analysis are included with this month's SMR.

COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT

The Public Services Department focus during April continued to be the 2011-2012 budget preparation and Strategic Plan Program Implementation. The Tax Allocation Bond (TAB) issuance resulted in the creation of a fund to stimulate economic growth, business development, and business retention within the Agency Project Area, in addition to the Infrastructure and Street Capital Improvement Projects. Proceeds may be utilized to off-set the Development Impact Fees for Drainage and/or Traffic for commercial, industrial, professional services, or retail sales. Proceeds may additionally be utilized for site specific improvements, streetscape improvements, or other related business development or retention purposes to leverage the fund utilization and increase the property tax increment. The City Council authorized an Old Towne program that contains three sequences of implementation, capital improvement projects, and a Branding program. The budget was adjusted and approved by the City Council. The Super Wal-Mart and Retail Shopping Center is in its final stages of project engineering and review and is still tentatively scheduled for a Spring start date.

The Commercial On-site Recycling remains mandatory but does allow for right sizing. All Business, Commercial, Institutional, and Multi-family (5 or more units) are required to participate in an on-site recycling diversion program. It is important that commercial, institutional, and multi-family users be aware of recycling opportunities and recycle whenever and whatever can be recycled. A special consideration should be directed to cardboard not being disposed of at the Ridgecrest Sanitary Landfill, but recycled. The City is reviewing individual businesses to assure On-site Recycling. A Public Awareness effort is on-going and any questions should be forwarded to the above numbers.



Economic Development

Activities for the month have centered on workforce housing which has resulted in several projects being consider by the Community Development Committee (CDC). These have included two major senior apartment developments and two single family developments, totaling over 250 new affordable housing units. These projects are to be funded from the City's Redevelopment housing set aside funds.

Other projects which have been worked on are the ongoing Super Wal-Mart development and several small local business relocations and expansions.

Finally, work has been ongoing on several solar projects now being considered in the valley.
