

RESOLUTION NO. 261

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST, CALIFORNIA, DETERMINING PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES FOR LEGAL, HOLIDAY AND OVERTIME WORK IN SAID CITY FOR CERTAIN CRAFTS OR TYPES OF WORKMEN

(Assessment District No. 2)

WHEREAS this City Council by resolution has ordered certain work or improvement particularly described in second amended resolution of intention, Resolution No. 251; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 1770 et seq. of the Labor Code of the State of California the City Council desires to determine, ascertain and fix the general prevailing rate of wages for legal, holiday and overtime work in said locality for each craft, classification or type of workman need to execute said contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST RESOLVES, DETERMINES AND ORDERS:

1. That the general prevailing rate of wages and employer payments for health, welfare, vacation and pension applicable to the work to be done is as follows:

2. That apprentices shall be paid standard wage paid to apprentices under regulations of trade at which he is employed. Information relative to employment of apprentices shall be obtained from the Director of the Department of Industrial Relations, who is the Administrative Officer of the California Apprenticeship Council.

3. That subsistence for each classifications shall be \$9.00 per day.

4. That any classification omitted herein shall be paid not less than \$2.50 per hour, plus employer payments set forth in the collective bargaining agreement applicable to the class or classification of workman involved, as defined in Section 1773.1 of the Labor Code.


5. That Overtime shall be paid at not less than one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the above scheduled rates, and Sundays and Holidays shall be paid not less than one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the above scheduled rates. The holidays upon which such rates shall be paid shall be all holidays recognized in the collective bargaining agreement applicable to the particular craft, classification or type of workmen employed on the project.


