

RESOLUTION NO. 81-59

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 123 AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 78-76 TO PROVIDE FOR CITY EMPLOYEE HOLIDAYS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California provided in Section 6700 of the Government Code of the State for changes in dates of celebrating certain holidays; and

WHEREAS, the same Section provides that local agencies may by resolution adopt such holidays for its employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST, CALIFORNIA, RESOLVES:

1. That Rule XI, Sec. 7, of Resolution No. 123 of the City Council of the City of Ridgecrest is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 7. Holidays: The holidays to be observed annually in this City are as follows:

New Year's Day, January 1.
Washington's Day, the third Monday in February.
Memorial Day, the last Monday in May.
Independence Day, July 4.
Labor Day, the first Monday in September.
Admission Day, September 9.
Columbus Day, the second Monday in October.
Veteran's Day, November 11.
Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November and the Friday immediately following.
Christmas Day, December 25.
Floating Holiday

Every day appointed by the President of the United States, the Governor of the State, or the Mayor of this City as a public fast, or holiday.

No permanent or probationary employee in the competitive service shall be required to be on duty on these holidays unless the employee's services are needed or required in the interests of the public health, safety, or general welfare, in which latter event any such employee shall be entitled to 8 hours compensatory time at time and a half off, at such time as in the discretion of the department head his services are not needed and required, or may be paid 8 hours overtime at time and a half.

When January 1, July 4, September 9, November 11, or December 25 falls upon a Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed. When January 1, July 4, September 9, November 11, or December 25 falls upon a Saturday, the preceeding Friday shall be observed. If a holiday falls on an employee's regularly scheduled time off, compensatory time off shall be granted.

Each employee is entitled to one floating holiday per calendar year,

effective January 1, 1982. Holiday must be taken between the dates of January 1 and December 31 of each year or forfeited and must be approved by the employee's Department Head.

2. The provisions of this Resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

3. That Resolution No. 78-76 is hereby rescinded.
