

RESOLUTION NO. 88-96

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST, CALIFORNIA, MAKING DESIGNATIONS AND APPOINTMENTS TO FULFILL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PERFORM DUTIES FOR SPECIAL ASSESSMENT PROCEEDINGS

WHEREAS, the City Council (the "City Council") of the City of Ridgecrest (the "City") is considering the formation of an assessment district, pursuant to the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913, being Division 12 (commencing with Section 10000) of the California Streets and Highways Code, for the construction of certain public works and improvements and acquisitions, if necessary, (collectively, the "Improvements"), as generally described in Exhibit A hereto;

WHEREAS, the lands to be specially assessed for the Improvements shall be included within an assessment district designated

ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 86-1
(PROSPECT PARK VILLAGE)

(the "Assessment District");

WHEREAS, the City now desires to make certain designations and appointments to fulfill responsibilities and perform duties incident to the assessment proceedings in the time, form and manner required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Ridgecrest does hereby resolve as follows:

SECTION 1. The above recitals and each of them are true and correct.

SECTION 2. The person appointed to assume the responsibilities and perform the duties of Superintendent of Streets for the Assessment District shall be

Director of Public Works
City of Ridgecrest

(the "Superintendent of Streets").

SECTION 3. The Office of the Superintendent of Streets, being the Office of the Director of Public Works for the City of Ridgecrest, is hereby designated as the place for recordation of the assessment roll and diagram which shall be kept as a permanent record of the Assessment District.

SECTION 4. The newspaper designated for all publications for the Assessment District shall be

THE DAILY INDEPENDENT

SECTION 5. The engineer(s) appointed to assume the responsibilities and perform the duties of Engineer of Work for the Assessment District shall be

ALBERT A. WEBB ASSOCIATES

(the "Engineer of Work"). An agreement, describing the terms of such appointment, between the City and the Engineer of Work in the form on file with the City Clerk is hereby approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute such agreement in the name of and on behalf of the City.

SECTION 6. The attorney(s) appointed as Bond Counsel shall be
ORRICK, HERRINGTON & SUTCLIFFE

(the "Bond Counsel"). An agreement, describing the terms of such appointment, between the City and the Bond Counsel in the form on file with the City Clerk is hereby approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute such agreement in the name of and on behalf of the City.

DESCRIPTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO BE ACQUIRED
PROPOSED ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 86-1 (PROSPECT PARK VILLAGE)
CITY OF RIDGECREST (CALIFORNIA)

The following listed improvements proposed for acquisition after installation and construction thereof within the boundaries of Proposed Assessment District No. 86-1 (Prospect Park Village), said District consisting of Units "A" through "H" of Tract No. 4244 recorded, respectively, in MB 32/77, MB 29/135-139, MB 32/80, MB 32/84, MB 32/87, MB 29/101-103, MB 30-111-112 and MB 32/92, Records of Kern County and the lands lying between the northwesterly boundary of said Tract and the centerline of French Avenue:

STREET IMPROVEMENTS: Construction of curbs, gutters, pavement, slope protection, fencing, appurtenances and appurtenant work in the southerly half of French Avenue, between China Lake Boulevard and Prospect Street, and in Prospect Street between French Avenue and Gold Canyon Drive;

DOMESTIC WATER, SANITARY SEWER, STORM DRAINAGE, STREET LIGHTING AND UNDERGROUND ELECTRICAL AND COMMUNICATIONS IMPROVEMENTS: Construction, reconstruction and installation of domestic water services; sanitary sewer mains and laterals; relocation of street lights; and, underground electrical facilities, appurtenances and appurtenant work in easements, including easements within private streets known as Bonita Street, Toro Street, Segundo Street, Carricart Lane and Searles Street, and in Prospect Street.
