

RESOLUTION NO. 94-32

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST, CALIFORNIA, CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 1994, FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AS REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS RELATING TO GENERAL LAW CITIES

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1.** A General Municipal Election is called and ordered to be held in the City of Ridgecrest on Tuesday, November 8, 1994, for the purpose of electing two (2) Members of the City Council for the full term of four years.
- Section 2.** Notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election in time, form and manner as required by law. The ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law. The City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to procure and furnish any and all ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election. The polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock AM on the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock PM of the same day when the polls shall be closed, except as provided in Section 14301 of the Elections Code of the State of California. In all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.
- Section 3.**
- (a) Pursuant to Elections Code Section 10012 each candidate for elective office to be voted for at the election may prepare a candidate's statement on an appropriate form provided by the City Clerk. The statement may include the name, age and occupation of the candidate and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate. The statement shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period. No candidate will be permitted to include additional materials in the sample ballot package.


- (b) Pursuant to the Voting Rights Act, the City Clerk shall have statements translated into Spanish in addition to English and have all translations made available upon request in the office of the City Clerk.
- (c) The City Clerk shall estimate the total cost of printing, handling, translating and mailing the candidate's statements filed pursuant to this section including translation costs and require each candidate filing a statement to pay the pro rata share of the cost in advance to the City as a condition of having a candidate's statement included in the voter's pamphlet. In the event of underpayment, the Clerk may require the candidate to pay the balance of the cost incurred. In the event of overpayment, the clerk shall prorate the excess amount among candidates and refund the excess amount paid within 30 days of the election.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall provide each candidate, or the candidate's representative, a copy of this Resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.

Section 5. This Resolution shall apply at the next ensuing municipal election and each municipal election after that time.
