

RESOLUTION NO. 94-41

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST APPROVING ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO THE SOURCE REDUCTION AND RECYCLING ELEMENT AS IT RELATES TO A NON-DISPOSAL FACILITIES ELEMENT AND TO LANGUAGE ADDING RECYCLING MARKET DEVELOPMENT ZONES AS A PROGRAM.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST RESOLVES as follows:

On June 14, 1994, the Planning Commission held a public hearing in accordance with §41793 of the Public Resources Code of the State of California and §18766(b) of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, and duly and regularly considered the application of the City of Ridgecrest for adoption of amendments to the Source Reduction and Recycling Element as it relates to a Non-disposal Facilities Element and to language adding recycling market development zones as a program, and made recommendation to the City Council for approval of amendments, and

On July 6, 1994, the City Council held a public hearing in accordance with §41793 of the Public Resources Code of the State of California and §18766(b) of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, and duly and regularly considered the application of the City of Ridgecrest for adoption of amendments to the Source Reduction and Recycling Element as it relates to a Non-disposal Facilities Element and to language adding recycling market development zones as a program

SECTION 1: FINDINGS

The City Council considered the evidence and approves the adoption of the amendments and makes these findings as set forth herein:

(a) The proposed element and language change are found to be internally consistent with the existing City of Ridgecrest General Plan and with the proposed City of Ridgecrest General Plan update and with the programs of these two plans; and

(b) The California Public Resources Code (PRC), Sections 41730 et seq. require every California city and county to prepare and adopt a Nondisposal Facility Element (NDFE) for all new Nondisposal facilities, and any expansions of existing Nondisposal facilities, which will be needed to implement local Source Reduction and Recycling Elements (SRREs); and

(c) The adoption or amendment of this element is not subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act per PRC Section 41735 (a).

SECTION 2: DESCRIPTION

The proposals are amendments to the Source Reduction and Recycling Element as it relates to addition of a Non-disposal Facilities Element (appendix A) and to language adding recycling market development zones as a program (appendix B).

SECTION 3: APPROVAL

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST HEREBY approves the proposed amendments to the Source Reduction and Recycling Element as it relates to a Non-disposal Facilities Element and to language adding recycling market development zones as a program having found that it is in the best interest of the public and is compatible with the existing general plan.

**APPENDIX A
CITY OF RIDGECREST
NONDISPOSAL FACILITY ELEMENT**

PRELIMINARY DRAFT

California Public Resources Code (PRC), Sections 41730 et seq, require every California city and county to prepare and adopt a Nondisposal Facility Element (NDFE) for all new Nondisposal facilities, and any expansions of existing Nondisposal facilities, which will be needed to implement local Source Reduction and Recycling Elements (SRREs). A Nondisposal facility is any solid waste facility required to obtain a state solid waste facility permit except a disposal facility or a transformation facility (PRC Section 40151).

The City of Ridgecrest has prepared, adopted, and hereby transmits to the Kern County Integrated Waste Management Plan Task Force as required by PRC Section 41735 (a) and (b) for review and comment regarding the regional impacts of the Nondisposal facilities identified in this Element.. The City is also submitting a copy of its NDFE to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for review and approval. The City's NDFE will be appended to the City's SRRE at the time of the next required revision.

This NDFE identifies the utilization of recycling facilities and composting facilities as Nondisposal facilities necessary to implement the City's waste diversion goals. The attached tables identify the Nondisposal facilities the City intends to utilize to implement its SRRE and meet the solid waste diversion requirements of PRC Section 41780. As indicated by PRC Section 41735 (a), the adoption or amendment of this element is not subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

●Alternative 5-10-4: Recycling Market Development Zones

The City would apply, in co-operation with Kern County and all other incorporated cities, for State of California designation as a Recycling Market Development Zone. This zone designation will allow qualifying businesses to apply for low interest loans, tax rebates on equipment purchase, and technical assistance at the State level.
