

RESOLUTION NO. 99-68

A RESOLUTION OF THE RIDGECREST CITY COUNCIL PERTAINING TO MEMBERSHIP ON CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEES

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIDGECREST
as follows:

Section 1. Purpose

The Ridgecrest Municipal Code calls for the City Council to create committees as necessary to conduct the work of the City. The Council has established four committees. This resolution deals with the membership of the committees.

Section 2. Infrastructure Committee

The Infrastructure Committee was formed to deal with issues involving streets and utilities, transit service, and solid waste disposal. Two Council Members appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council and two Planning Commissioners, appointed by the Commission, shall serve on the committee.

Section 3. City Organization Committee

The City Organization Committee was formed to deal with issues involving public safety, personnel, finance, and communication. Two Council Members appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council shall serve on the committee.

Section 4. Economic Development Committee

The Economic Development Committee was formed to deal with issues involving economic development, planning, and zoning. Two Council Members, appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council, and two Planning Commissioners, appointed by the Commission, shall serve on the committee.

Section 5. Quality of Life Committee

The Quality of Life Committee is formed to deal with issues involving youth, parks and recreation, and senior citizens. Two Council Members, appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council, shall serve on the committee.

Section 6. Ad Hoc Issues

With the advice and consent of the Council, the Mayor may request analyses of issues not described above by the permanent committees or by assignment to an *ad hoc* committee.

Section 7. Committee Functions

The function of standing committees will be as follows:

1. Provide oversight (receive information) and advisory to the City Council.
2. Focus on community outreach.
3. Recommend the City's position on State legislative matters.
4. Review proposed ordinances and policies to the Council.
5. The committees will be recipients of information in their particular areas of focus, will make recommendations to the City Council, and will not direct staff.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Resolution No. 99-62 is hereby rescinded.
